Night work: traffic sign installation on Pennant Hills Road and Loch Maree Avenue, Thornleigh

Further to our notification N0097 in February 2016, please be advised that night work activities will need to take place on Pennant Hills Road and Loch Maree Avenue, Thornleigh for up to two weeks, starting on 7 July 2016.

NorthConnex recently constructed a light vehicle driveway on Loch Maree Avenue and a slip lane on Pennant Hills Road for access into the Trelawney Street Compound in Thornleigh. The slip lane will allow trucks removing spoil to leave the compound via Pennant Hills Road.

As part of the site access establishment work for the compound, traffic signage will be installed on Pennant Hills Road and Loch Maree Avenue to advise motorists of upcoming changed traffic conditions around the Trelawney Street Compound.

What are we doing?

The project will install traffic signs to clearly advise changes in speed limits, lane configuration and access to the compound. Refer to the map overleaf for the location of the new signs.

Due to the close proximity of the work to traffic on Pennant Hills Road, this work is required to be completed at night to ensure the safety of workers and motorists.

Traffic sign installation

Traffic sign installation work will take place in the following locations:

Pennant Hills Road, Thornleigh

- Two signs on the corner of Pennant Hills Road and Phyllis Avenue
- Three signs on the eastern footpath between Trelawney Street and Nelson Street.

Loch Maree Avenue, Thornleigh

- Two signs on the northern verge and one sign on the southern verge, both between ten to twenty metres from the Pennant Hills Road intersection.

Plant and equipment used for this work includes:

- Vacuum truck
- Drill and hand tools

During these night work activities you will experience noise. We will make every effort to reduce the noise by:

- Turning off machinery when not in use
- Using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- Scheduling work to take place no more than two nights in a row and limiting work to no more than three nights in one week at the same location.

Work hours

Night work activities will take place between 9.30pm to 5am from 7 July for up to three nights a week for about two weeks between Sunday to Thursday nights. The team will be accessing the Trelawney Street compound for facilities and equipment.

Changed traffic conditions

Traffic management and signage will be in place to ensure the safety of motorists, residents, pedestrians and workers. This includes two southbound slow lane closures for up to three nights a week between 9.30pm to 5am Sunday to Thursday.

The community team will contact residents most impacted by the work.
