Night work: Traffic switch on Barclay Road Bridge

Dear resident

As part of ongoing work to lengthen Barclay Road Bridge, traffic will be temporarily moved from the eastern side of the bridge to the western side of the bridge. The traffic changes will be in place for about eight months to complete lengthening activities on the eastern side of the road. A map explaining the changes is provided overleaf.

Due to the high traffic volumes on the Barclay Road Bridge and for the safety of workers and motorists the work to implement the changes will take place from **5pm on Saturday 10 December 2016 to 10am on Sunday 11 December 2016**, weather permitting. If work is unable to take place during this period it will be carried out at the same time on the following weekend. The main work activities include:

- > Moving traffic from the eastern to the western side of the bridge
- > Asphaltting and sealing the bridge surface
- > Moving traffic barriers to create the work zone on the eastern side of the bridge
- > Removing existing line marking and painting in the new lane markings
- > Modifying signage on the bridge and approaches and installing new signs
- > Modifying the traffic signals
- > Installing temporary street lights.

Plant and equipment for this work includes a crane, light vehicles, lighting towers, hand tools, elevated work platform, concrete trucks, street sweeper, vibration rollers, excavator, and power tools.

You will experience noise during some of these activities and we will make every effort to minimise impact by:

- > Consulting with directly affected residents
- > Ensuring noisy work is not carried out more than three nights in one week

- > Using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- > Turning off equipment and vehicles when not in use
- > Using solar-powered lighting towers.

During the night work one lane over the bridge will be closed and stop/go traffic control will be in place. The existing reduced speed limit at 40 km/h will remain and pedestrian management will also be in place to ensure the safety of motorists, residents and workers.
